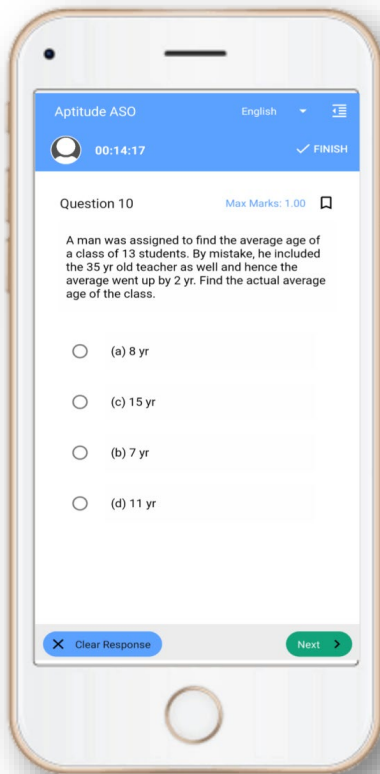

The basic core of evolution – survival and reproduction has been proven over and over through our various behavioral patterns. <sup>one such is reaction to external stimuli.</sup> Let's retrograde and explore what are some exciting concepts that have been performed by humans before us and how did it occur. Almost every organism has the tendency to react to certain stimuli for survival.

This reaction to each and every situation has an evolutionary basis of adaptation.

The study of human emotions dates back to the 19th century and psychologists have since then discovered many reasons for every emotion, yet these are just theories.

<sup>Emotions are induced by repetitive encounter of a situation and habituated by an adaptation to it.</sup> The arousal of emotions and their assumed structures is said to occur due to repeated encounters with a situation followed by the adaptation of the encounter. Human

emotions have been linked to adaptively regulate emotion-gathering mechanisms.

The emotion of fear which is associated with ancient parts of the brain has presumably evolved among our pre-mammal ancestors while the emotion of a mother's love called the 'filial emotion' has seen to evolve among early mammals. [Various emotions work as manipulative strategies that favour survival]. Feigning emotions by an accused person may help him be saved from the punishment. An exaggerated display of anger

is also associated with manipulating or threatening someone. Despite there being several emotions for various events, ironically the most interesting emotion is the emotion of disgust. Disgust is aroused when the body senses a danger to the immunity or the physiology of the human. The disgusted memory is associated with alerting the brain of a potentially dangerous substance. A few studies have shown that the encoding triggered in adaptive memory for problems is stronger than any other behaviour. This makes us instantly have a disgusted expression at the sight of something that makes us uncomfortable or uneasy. These expressions are also closely linked to self-protective communication.

In capital markets, both primary and secondary, only low levels of technology are in use. In primary markets the lack of computerization and communication facilities results in long delays in the finalization of subscription of new issues. The Bombay and National Stock Exchanges have recently adopted screen based trading. At the lower end of banking, that is, rural banking, many of these technologies may not have relevance except for the wealthy, at least for a decade or more. The problem in the bulk of our village communities is to generate money and make it available to workers, not merely for their subsistence but to carry out some economic activities of their own with small investments. Financial or lending systems for such poor rural folk could be patterned on the 'Grameen Bank Systems', successfully operated in Bangladesh. 1. There are 20 boys and 24 girls in Sec-A of class 9 and 24 boys and 20 girls in Sec-B. If one student from each section is taken randomly find the probability of :
  - (a) Getting one boy and one girl
  - (b) Getting at least one boy
2. The sum of three numbers is 68. If the ratio between first and second be 2 : 3 and that between second and third be 5 : 3, then find the second number.
3. After covering a distance of 30km with a uniform speed, the speed of the train is reduced to  $\frac{4}{5}$  of its original speed due to some defect, so the train reaches its destination late by 45 minutes. Had it happened after covering 18km more, the train would have reached 9 minutes earlier. Find the speed of the train and distance of the journey.
4. If the sum of 1<sup>st</sup> three term of a GP series is 28 and their product is 512 then find the 10<sup>th</sup> term.
5. As the price of petrol is increased by 10%, a person purchases 500ml less than his regular purchase. Find the original quantity of petrol he purchases.
6. A wizard having power of mystic in conditions and magical medicines seeing a cock, fight going on, spoke privately to both the owners of cocks. To one he said; if your bird wins, then you give me your stake money, but if you do not win, I shall give you two third of that. Going to the other, he promised in the same way to give three fourths. From both of them his gain would be only 12 gold coins. Find the stake of money each of the cock-owners have.
7. A hollow cone is cut by a plane by parallel to the base and the upper portion is removed. If the curved surface of the remainder is  $\frac{8}{9}$  of the curved surface of the whole cone. Find the ratio of the line-segment into which the cone's altitude is divided by the plane.

8. In a potato race a bucket is placed at the starting point, which is 5m from the first potato, and other potatoes are placed 3m apart in a straight line. There are  $n$  potatoes in the line. Each competitor starts from the bucket, picks of the nearest potato, runs back with it, drops it in the bucket, runs back to pick up the next potato, runs to the bucket to drop it in the bucket, and she continue in the same way until all potatoes are in the bucket. What is the total distance the competitor has to run ?
9. A two digit number is obtained by either multiplying sum of the digits by 8 or adding 1 or by multiplying the difference of the digits by 13 and adding 2. Find the number.
10. By selling 400 articles, a man lost the S.P of 30 articles. Had he purchased them for Rs. 537.50, what would have been the S.P of 20 articles ?
